"I think he's a winner and I'm going to back him!"

John H. Peace, founding trustee and major supporter, shares his thoughts with Sandra O. Gold, Executive V.P., on the occasion of the Tenth Anniversary of The Foundation.

John: My first gift was based on my relationship with Arnold Gold. Let me compare the situation to the thoroughbred racing business, something I know a little about. At a horse sale, how do you pick out the one special horse, out of the 20,000 offered for sale? Sometimes, for \$25,000 you can choose a horse who will achieve greatness and win huge purses. I said to myself, "Arnold's some damn smart guy...I think he's a winner and I'm going to back him! It was instinct, a kind of karma, but also experience."

Sandra: In what way?

John: One experience that comes to mind is the time one of my sons, who was a patient of Arnold's (and who now is a Foundation Trustee), was in the hospital for serious spinal surgery. One evening I had been at a ball game that ended very late, but I wanted to peek in on my son before I went home. The ward floor at Babies Hospital was pitch dark when I arrived at one in the morning. When my eyes became accustomed, I identified Arnold sitting at my son's bedside. My comfort level about the care my child was getting from his doctor shot way up. And it has never come down. I hope that the work of

Sandra: What were your dreams for The Foundation, and how has it measured up?

John: My wife Agnes and I weren't sure about how the plan to foster humanism would be accomplished. But we were betting on the guy who was doing the dreaming, Arnold. We gave...and hoped. And the accomplishments to date have been SUPER...UNBELIEVABLE... greater than any expectation... and in only ten years!

Sandra: What challenges do you see that are ahead?

John: My quick reaction is that the job is so important now and the need so vast, The Foundation will need more support than imagined. It may get swamped because the mission is right on the button and the objectives so needed. Right now, we are only a handful of people. To get the job done right, our small group needs big, powerful and generous help from the corporate world, the insurance industry and even the government. From my viewpoint, probably the most critical issue in medicine today for everyone is the one The Foundation is putting on the table. We need more help in carrying the ball!

Sandra: Do you have any specific ideas?

John: To be blunt, The Foundation has made incredible progress in a very short time. With an idea that has been proven a winner, and I believe no one in our country will disagree that it's a vital one, we must grow not just 100% in the next few years, but 1,000%. We need to find the people who can help us make that happen. We need more men and

women who see the picture and will get us to that next step. We need their abilities and their backing.

Sandra: Has the creation of The Foundation impacted on your family in any way?

John: I hope my involvement with the work of The Foundation will set an example for my children and other people. Î believe Bill's interest in The Foundation will provide continuity and family representation far into the future. When Agnes attended nursing school at Bellevue, she took pride in her work. The starched white cap she wore was a symbol of the pride she felt for her profession as well as the love she felt in her heart. It seems that things have changed dramatically for the worse throughout the medical professions. The Foundation provides our family a chance to help get medicine back on the right track.

Sandra: What would you say to other potential givers about why they should support The Foundation?

[Agnes Peace jumped animatedly into the conversation] "Join the smart crowd that wants to return humanism, love and healing to medicine! Human beings deserve better than what they are getting now. When the technology wasn't so terrific, people got better care. Today compassion and caring lag behind the science and we have to reverse that trend. It's really a great cause."



Marking our Tenth Anniversary: Now and the Future!

The future of medicine is more encouraging than ever with regard to curing disease and alleviating human suffering. Scientific discoveries and technological advances are developing at the most rapid rate in history. It is a time of tremendous promise.

However, the specters of depersonalization and the preference for institutional considerations loom greater than the needs of the individual. These tendencies are particularly disturbing when confronting the horrors and complexities associated with human illness and suffering.

The relationships established between a person who is sick and his or her caregivers are among the most intimate and delicate in the human experience. How can we reassure ourselves that proper care will be provided? Today we seek better guarantees that health care professionals will take our best interests to heart, as well as to mind.

In 1988 a dedicated group of concerned individuals intent on advocating for humanism in medicine created The Arnold P. Gold Foundation. During the past decade the challenges to maintaining humanism have increased dramatically. At the same time, we have been pleased to discover that there have been increased efforts and actions by many others to keep the issue in the forefront of public concern. These new alliances strengthen the advocacy efforts for humanism in medicine.

The Healthcare Foundation of New Jersey (HFNJ), formed in 1997, is an example of this extended effort. In addition to the creation of the humanism in medicine web site, www.humanism-in-medicine.org., made possible by a significant grant from the HFNJ, this past July they initiated the first Humanistic Patient Care Awards "recognizing compassion, sensitivity, respect and cultural competence in the delivery of care to patients and their families." Monetary awards were presented to recognize four individuals at each of 13 Newark, NI area hospitals, including dieticians, housekeepers, EMT workers, nurse practitioners, residents and social workers. We are delighted to see that the focus on humanism in all aspects of health care is accelerating, sometimes stimulated by our efforts at medical schools.

Through the proliferation of White Coat Ceremonies (see pages 6 and 7), funded by advocacy grants from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation of Princeton, NJ, we have developed working relationships with deans and administrators at more than 100 of the 145 American schools of medicine and osteopathy. Furthermore,

this summer we initiated and funded a pilot program at five schools to create a transitional rite of passage for third year students beginning the clinical phase of training, to help prepare them to meet their first patients.

One of our Foundation's original goals was to assess how the medical school selection process impacts humanism in medicine. Last June in Alexandria, Virginia, at the "Barriers III" symposium, the exploration of this subject was made possible by a new grant from the Josiah Macy, Jr. Foundation with

> additional help from The Healthcare Foundation of New Jersey. We are encouraged that improvements in the system can assure that the candidates admitted to study medicine in the future will embody excellence in two important areas: compassion and scientific expertise.

> Our Strategic Planning Committee, under the direction of Dr. Robert Mellins, meets regularly to define policy and scope. The goals recently set forth by this Committee include: developing a secure financial base; replicating our successful programs and supporting the creation of innovative new ones; and becoming a key player in the national health care delivery system focusing on humanism in medicine as a priority concern.

Thanks to the continuing support of advocates, friends and colleagues like you, we believe that we will be able to achieve these goals. We look forward to the next decade.

"First taking care of those patients who would live"

Our twenty-seven year old son had a terrible disease and an equally devastating prognosis. Still, we held onto the vague hope that during his lifetime some drug or procedure would be developed to successfully change the course of his illness. His wife also focused on the glimmer of a possibility that scientific achievement would accelerate in time to impede the aggressive nature of the pancreatic cancer.

We began to investigate any and all available experts in the field. While learning about what was being worked on, we also sadly discovered what hadn't

worked. As the dread disease was sapping the strength of our beloved and once vibrant son, we hoped to discover the scientific answer that would result in the total elimination of the cancer. Meanwhile, we also frantically searched for second and third opinions throughout the country.

The news of the conception of our son's first child was confirmed to him in a hospital bed as he was recovering from surgery. He lived to hold his daughter, but not to see her through her first year of life.

It took two years for the disease to conquer all of us and take our son's life. This time was filled with innumerable disappointments and constant pain but none as crushing as the statement made to us in the waiting room of a busy

specialist early in the saga. After an hour or so, the doctor passed through and told us it would be some time longer to wait as he was "first taking care of those patients who would live."

The doctor's words still cut today. Even though we had known the substance of his comment prior to his speaking, his tactless cruelty salted our wounds.

We pray that the new doctors in training will be students of The Arnold P. Gold Foundation School of Humanism in Medicine. We hope that doctors will never treat a dying patient as though the patient were already dead. That is why we urge you to support this special Foundation.

"Who gets in?"

Medical schools invest considerable effort and significant resources to select students who have the potential for success in a vigorous educational program and in a demanding profession. Admissions committees are challenged annually to choose a small group of students from a very large number of

applicants, at very competitive schools sometimes one place for every 700 appli-

In order to accomplish this task, admissions committees must assess not only intellectual or academic ability but also personal characteristics such as commitment, integrity and maturity. The task of assessing intellectual ability is relatively easy; selecting individuals who will become "humanistic" physicians is very difficult.

Chicago Pritzker School of Medicine this summer in Alexandria, Virginia.

The symposium attendees included 42 deans and others representing 26 diverse U. S. medical schools. The group examined each phase of the admissions process in order to identify how to better select the most "humane" applicants. In addition, they identified the current barriers to achieving this goal.

Among the barriers the Deans identified were: the lack of information concerning applicants' personal credentials; the subjective nature and questionable reliability of recommendation letters; the variability in the interview process; the pressure to emphasize candidates' quantitative academic data

for national media ratings; and the complex role that pre-medical school advisors have in a student's formative phase.

Many positive ideas resulted from this meeting, among them the suggestion to convene a special conference specifically geared for pre-medical advisors. There was unanimity among those in attendance attesting to the significance and insights exchanged at this symposium.

Young Professors Demonstrate Humanism and Excellence in Teaching

Through The Gold Foundation Associate/Assistant Professorship Grant Program, five brilliant young physicians at Columbia University's College of Physicians & Surgeons are able to devote extra time to teaching and working with medical students, patients and families.

The Foundation's Board recognizes that role-models play a significant part in the training of doctors. In 1998, the Board voted to expand the professorship grant program. Two additional stipends were awarded to Dr. Steve Miller, Director of the Pediatric Emergency Room and to Dr. Steven Stylianos, Director of the Pediatric Trauma Program at the Columbia Presbyterian Medical Center in New York City.

The other outstanding professorship grant recipients at Columbia are: Dr. Abba Cargan, Director of the Pediatric Neurology Ambulatory Clinic, a role-model teacher who is helping to improve and coordinate diverse therapeutic services for children with neurological diseases such as epilepsy and cerebral palsy; Dr. Jay F. Dobkin, Associate Professor of Medicine and director of Columbia's HIV unit; and Barron Lerner, M.D./Ph.D., the Angelica Berrie Gold Foundation Assistant Professor who teaches medical ethics and medical history.


In between are the "specialties." In the circumstance of this auspicious event there are these 160 accomplished, aspiring young men and women embarking on medical careers which today, this
